
INTRODUCTION


Tshangu Lake


Rumtek Monastery

Nathula Pass



Visit the Directorate of Handicrafts and Handloom to see and buy authentic Sikkimese crafts such as wood carvings, thangka paintings, and woven textiles.




TRAVEL TIPS AND GUIDE

Weather: The weather in March is pleasant, with cool temperatures ranging between 10°C to 15°C. It's a great time to visit as the region is beginning to thaw after winter.



Clothing: Pack light woolens, especially if you plan to visit higher altitudes like Tsongmo Lake or Nathula Pass, where temperatures are colder.

Permits: Keep in mind that some tourist spots like Nathula Pass require special permits, which can be arranged through local tour operators.
